



Corona Regulations

From November 3, 2020

NEW RESTRICTIONS ARE IN PLACE TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE CORONAVIRUS. THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS ANNOUNCED A SECOND LOCKDOWN IN AUSTRIA. THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS ARE IN PLACE FROM TUESDAY, 3 NOVEMBER 2020:

- Reduce your contact to other people and stay at home as much as possible.
- In public space: Keep a safe distance from people outside your household and wear a face mask.
- The government has imposed a national night-time curfew from 20:00 to 6:00. During this time, you must not leave your home or visit other people unless you have to go to work, run urgent errands, need to help others, or want to exercise outdoors.
- Private meetings: You can only meet with persons from one other household.
- All private events such as weddings, anniversaries or birthday parties are prohibited! Funerals can take place and can be attended by a maximum number of 50 people.
- Contact sports such as football are prohibited! Indoor sports facilities including indoor swimming pools remain closed (except for professional sports).
- Hospitality venues (such as pubs, restaurants, cafes, etc.) stay closed. Takeaway and delivery of food and beverages are allowed.
- All events have been cancelled. Theatres, cinemas and concert halls stay closed. Libraries remain open but to support physical distancing, the maximum number of people allowed is one customer per ten square metres.
- All shops stay open. When out shopping or running errands you must wear a face mask and keep a distance of at least one metre from others. To support physical distancing, the maximum number of people allowed in shops is one customer per ten square metres. Services such as hairdressers and beauty salons remain open.
- Kindergarten and schools stay open and children continue to attend kindergarten and school. Upper secondary schools and universities switch to distance learning.
- Residents in nursing homes can have visitors every other day. A maximum of one visitor per resident per day is allowed. Visitors must present a negative coronavirus test result or wear a face mask.
